

We'll be doing a little of it all - tours of antebellum homes, canoeing the Mississippi (optional), visiting ancient Indian burial mounds, enjoying some spectacular gardens, listening to blues in historic honkey-tonks, savoring a dinner created by renowned chef Regina Charboneau in a beautiful historic home, perhaps attending an authentic

Southern ball (optional), guided historic cemetery tour and if you like, even partaking in some gambling at the local casino (optional).

On Friday, March 31, we'll drive to Natchez (a 6 hour drive from Dallas).

We'll organize carpools for those interested.

There is a unique (optional) opportunity to canoe the Mississippi River that afternoon at 2 p.m. on a 4-hour canoe trip. Become one with the Mississippi's nature as our guide entertains us with tales of the area and points out interesting local animals and foliage. This adventure is highly recommended in many travel guides and is a different and special way to see the river. These are multi-person canoes so this event works for all levels of experience and ability. This is optional and not included in the price of the trip.
