We also now have a new Bylaw change regarding membership. Please read this carefully. Scott McGarvey, Debbie Rima or I are happy to help you figure out when you need to renew if you are not sure.

If you joined the club or renewed your membership between March 1, 2017 and March 14, 2017, your membership will expire on May 31, 2018, at which time your renewal will automatically revert to an annual membership.

If you joined the club or renewed your membership prior to March 1, 2017, your membership will expire on May 31, 2017. We recommend you not renew your membership until June 1, 2017 or after to get the most value out of your current membership. When you do renew, your new membership will expire one year from the date you renew. So, if you renew on June 1, 2017, your membership will expire on June 1, 2018. Again, if you renew your current membership prior to your May 31, 2017 expiration date, your membership will expire one year from the date you renew so we suggest you wait until June 1, 2017 to renew. Remember, you must be a member in good standing to join us for one of our many trips and participate in some of our activities that require membership, so be sure you renew on your expiration date!

Anyone joining the club effective today will have a membership that expires one year from the date they join.

Our website will be adjusted to automatically reflect the dates above. It will also automatically send out 3 reminders that it is time to renew. We are here to help you if you are not sure when and how to renew.

Lone Star Rated Number One in TSC Telluride Races

Lone Star distinguished itself as Number One Club in the First Division in races held March 1st, 2017 at the TSC Final Showdown in Telluride. Participation was strong, with 12 Lone Star racers running the gates. First Place racing awards were earned by Jo Mowdy, David Hensley and Wayne May, and Jo was awarded Fastest Female. Second Place was awarded to Dwight Burt and Tom Mowdy. Congrats to all and kudos to Carol Bonn, who did a great job as Race Director!

Nineteen Lone Star skiers enjoyed six days of skiing, racing, parties and fun in Telluride, a high-altitude, independently-owned Colorado ski area noted for exceptional snow and terrain that offers everything from scenic blue cruisers to wide-open bowl skiing; from beautiful glades to heart-thumping chutes. Mother Nature cooperated, bringing us a nice two-foot snowfall Monday into Tuesday, followed by several days of sunshine and moderate temperatures. The trails on the mountain were consistently well-marked, and lift lines were few and short.

Lone Star stayed in five 2-bedroom condos at the Mountain Lodge, with ski-in, ski-out access, and a short shuttle ride (or walk) away from the Village gondola.

We welcomed three New Members on the trip – Dwight Burt and John Parent. Members joining the trip were geographically diverse, including participants from Chicago, Arkansas and California as well as various parts of Texas.

Lone Star Skiers joined a total of 198 participants from 9 Texas Ski Council clubs staying at three properties in Mountain Village – Bear Creek, Mountain Lodge and The Peaks. TSC hosted many fun events, including a Mountain Tour, Welcome Party, Mardi Gras Pub Crawl, Mountain Picnic, Wine Tasting event, Farewell Dinner and Awards Presentation, and three Apres Skis. Example: If you bring enough slices of cheese for 72 sandwiches, bring enough meat and bread for 72 sandwiches. Here is a breakdown of all the items....

Sliced sandwich bread

Sliced Meat — DO NOT bring the kind from the deli. If you have questions please ask.

Sliced cheese - Please do not bring spicy cheese

Baby Carrots - Do not bring whole carrots that need to be cut

Raisins - A big bag of Sunmaid Raisins would be great.

Sandwich Bags that zip

Plain yellow mustard
