Issues to vote on at March meeting... The board of directors will present a proposed bylaw change at the next quarterly meeting on March 13, 2018. We would like our membership to consider eliminating the position of VP Marketing. Because of the ease of reaching more potential members via social media, this position is no longer necessary and is currently vacant (and has been vacant off and on over the past few years). The tasks associated with the duties described for this position can be assigned to a director as necessary by the President. Please read the proposed changes below and be prepared to vote on this Bylaw change on March 13, 2018.

ARTICLE VIII: OFFICERS EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE: The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Vice President Trips, Vice President Publications, Vice President Marketing, Vice President Membership, Vice President Activities, Treasurer, Secretary, and Executive Director. In the absence of the President, or in the event of his or her inability or refusal to act, the other officers, in order of succession listed here, shall perform the duties of the President. The Executive Committee shall decide the authority of any Club director to represent said Club. The Club's President and Vice President Trips are the duly authorized representatives to the Texas Ski Council. In the event that either is unable to attend the TSC meeting, the President may authorize another Board member(s) to fill the vacancy(s) for the meeting.




Remembering Beaver Creek




